The book of Daniel speaks of the coming of "the Son of Man" – Jesus claimed this 3x
The first 2 tell us: 1) The Son of Man came not to be served but to serve (Mark 10:45); 2) The Son of Man came to seek and to save the lost (Luke 19:10);
The last one tells us: 3) The Son of Man has come eating and drinking (Luke 7:34).
After this, Jesus went out and saw a tax collector by the name of Levi sitting at his tax booth. "Follow me," Jesus said to him, and Levi got up, left everything and followed him. Then Levi held a great banquet for Jesus at his house, and a large crowd of tax collectors and others were eating with them. Hospitality has Kingdom power But it's not the same as "Entertaining 4 Ways they are Different: 1. Entertainment Hospitality This distinction is one of orientation. It answers the question: "Who is the center of attention?"
2. Entertainment Hospitality This distinction is one of <i>aspiration</i> : It answers the question: "What is my purpose?"
3. Entertainment Hospitality This distinction is one of <i>communion</i> . It answers the question: "How is intimacy being fostered?"
4. Entertainment Hospitality This distinction is one of <i>inclusion</i> . Answers the question "Who, right now, is in need of Jesus' love?"
